

# **CENTURY** for Alternative Provision

Our CENTURY courses are designed to assess students' individual needs and set nuggets at an appropriate level in order to fill their gaps in learning. This approach can work particularly well for students who may have spent lengthy periods of time out of formal education.

Our courses are created in key stages. If students in a class have very different needs, it might be best to create a class for each individual student. This allows you the option of setting the most appropriate course for each student. This is particularly important for secondary students who may still be working at a primary level. If this is the case, make sure students are removed from any classes that might be studying more challenging courses.

Here is a rough guide to our course names to help you to assign the correct courses:

## GCSE

Any course with GCSE in the title has been designed to support students who will be taking that qualification. All of our English literature courses are designed for GCSE.

## **Functional Skills**

These courses are mapped to the government assessment objectives. Our English courses are designed to cover the skills required for the Reading and Writing elements for all exam boards. They are mapped to the government assessment objectives.
