Mary Anning - Biography

Mary Anning was a famous fossil hunter. She was born in 1799, in the seaside town of Lyme Regis in Dorset, on the south coast of England. Mary had nine siblings, but sadly only Mary and her brother Joseph lived to adulthood.

She realised they were actually fossils! When she was just 12 years old, Mary spotted something unusual poking out from a cliff. She had discovered the skull of a mysterious creature. At first, she thought it was a crocodile. However, what she had actually discovered was the first complete fossil of an ancient reptile. The reptile was called an ichthyosaur, which means 'fish lizard'.

Over the course of her life, Mary made many incredible discoveries. One of these discoveries included a marine reptile called a plesiosaur. She also discovered a flying reptile called a dimorphodon. These discoveries made her very popular among the scientists of her time. Scientists would visit her for advice and to talk about fossils and other scientific ideas. Mary's fossils helped scientists understand how life began. They came to realise that prehistoric animals were not the same as the





living animals that surround us today.

As Mary's fossil career flourished, she decided to open a shop in her home town. In her shop, she sold shells, rocks and fossils. Fossil collectors from far and wide came to visit the shop and purchase Mary's fossils.

Today, Mary is remembered as one of the greatest fossil hunters to have ever lived. Her discoveries and passion for fossils have inspired many others to find out more about our ancient world.
