This company is owned by Jeff Bezos. Jeff Bezos is American. He is the second richest man in the world. Bezos also owns Amazon.


Virgin Galactic

and see the earth floating in the darkness. You could also experience what it's like to feel weightless. This is because there is no gravity in space.






How much will it cost?

Travelling to space is not cheap. Only people who are very rich will be able to afford it. A seat in a Virgin Galactic flight costs \$450,000 (£330,000). The flight takes passengers to the edge of space. A seat on one of SpaceX's trips is at least ten times more expensive. The space shuttle orbits the Earth and takes 3 days to complete.

Is it worth it?

Some people are very excited by the idea of space travel. However, some think that it is a waste of money. They argue that this money would be better spent on Earth. Billions of dollars are spent each year on space travel. Could this money be better spent on improving our planet instead?
