Our Precious Rainforests

Over half the world's rainforests have already been destroyed. Every second, an area of rainforest the size of a football pitch is being destroyed.

The biggest reason for this destruction is farming. Trees are being cut down to clear land to grow crops or raise cattle.

Trees are also cut down for their wood. The wood is mainly used in construction, but large amounts are also used to make furniture and paper.

Why is this a problem? Rainforests are home to about half of the world's plant and animal species. Over 16,000 tree species can be found in the Amazon rainforest. Some of these species are unique to this area, so if we lose them we lose the species forever. Destroying rainforests also threatens the animals that live amongst the trees. Many animals are dying because their habitats are being completely destroyed.

Destroying the rainforests also damages our environment. The plants and trees in the rainforests produce around one fifth of the oxygen that humans need to breathe. They also take in carbon dioxide. Carbon dioxide is a greenhouse gas that causes global warming. When we cut trees down, there are fewer trees to absorb this gas. This makes temperatures around the world warmer. Global warming is already starting to have a negative impact on humans around the planet.

Luckily there are some things we can all do to help. Look out for the 'Rainforest Alliance' or 'Fair Trade' logo when you're doing your shopping. You may see this on products such as bananas, chocolate and shampoo. Products with these logos have been produced without damaging the rainforest.

There are also lots of charities that work to protect rainforests.

Donating to these charities can help them to save the rainforests.
