EARLY LIFE

Charles Dickens grew up in London. He began working in a warehouse at the young age of 11 after his father was sent to prison. Charles had to largely fend for himself from a young age so he explored all areas of London. This undoubtedly influenced his writing in later years.

VISITING AMERICA

In 1842, Charles visited America to complete a reading tour. His writing was so popular that upon arriving in several towns and cities in America, Charles found himself mobbed by hundreds of people!

A CHRISTMAS CAROL

A Christmas Carol was published in December in 1843, and is perhaps Dickens' most famous publication. It was so popular with Victorian readers that the first edition sold out by Christmas Eve! "Reflect upon your present blessings — of which every man has many — not on your past misfortunes, of which all men have some."
