Writing assessments are traditionally time-consuming and can vary in reliability and quality. We have a project funded by [MIT Solve](#) to solve this problem.

We are currently at an exciting stage of training our machine learning model. We will train the model with human markers who will mark and provide feedback against our rubric. For the project initially, we are looking to mark over 2000 scripts to create the training data. These scripts will be marked by a small team of experienced current and former English teachers.

We encourage applications from experienced and reliable English teachers, from varied teaching backgrounds, seeking flexible part-time working hours for a fixed period.

Standardisation training and moderation meetings will take place during office hours. Working hours can be flexible around other commitments based on your availability. Those in full-time employment are likely to be unsuitable for this marking project.
