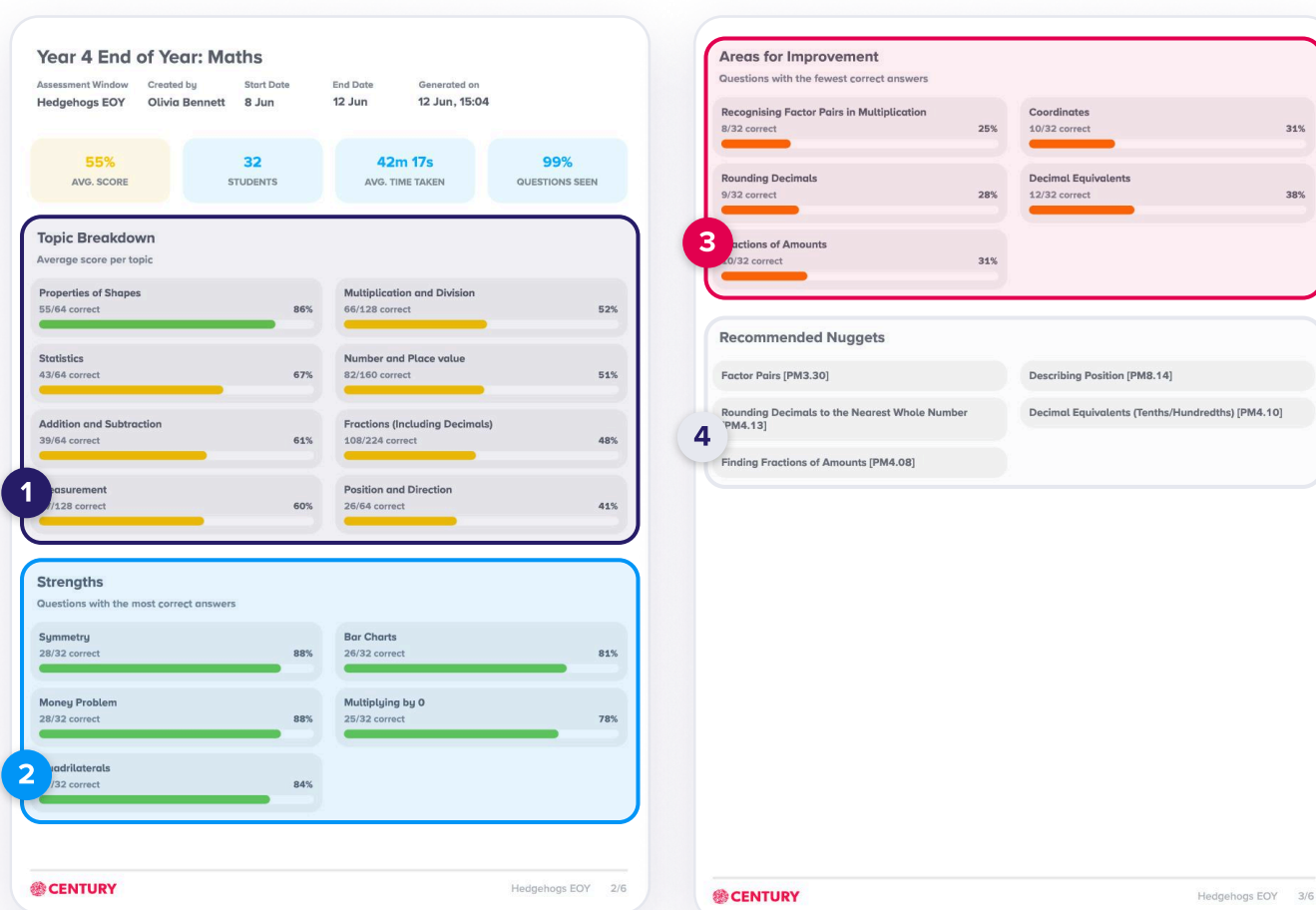


# Using Your CENTURY Class Report

The class report shows you how students have scored in the CENTURY assessments. It gives you a great visual for handovers, with areas for improvement highlighted along with recommended nuggets to fill these gaps.

## Reading the report

The first pages give you everything to act on. Further into the report you'll find a question-by-question and student-by-student breakdown for when you need to dig deeper. Here's what each section tells you:



Pages 2–3 shown · individual student breakdowns follow on later pages.

- 1 Topic breakdown** – a subject-by-subject view of how the class did across each topic of the curriculum, colour-coded so strengths and gaps are immediately visible.
- 2 Strengths** – the areas or objectives your class performed best on. Find the individual students who struggled on the CSV download to target intervention.
- 3 Areas for improvement** – the areas or objectives where your class struggled the most, highlighting exactly where gaps need to be addressed in September.
- 4 Recommended nuggets** – CENTURY's suggested nuggets linked directly to the areas for improvement, ready to assign as homework or to share with the next teacher.

## Three ways to use it



Share it with the **incoming teacher** as a handover.



Assign the recommended nuggets as end-of-term or **summer homework**.



Use the topic breakdown to inform **September planning**.
